Show & Tell: Healthy Youth Survey 2016 – Emily Popovich, TAC Immediate Past Chair

- Healthy Youth Survey: an optional survey that schools can participate in. 6th-12th grade is surveyed.
- Resources are open-sourced. Results can be searched by county, but requires login for specific school districts.
- The presentation covered areas such as alcohol, marijuana, tobacco, and e-cigarette/vape usage by minors.
- One of the more surprising data results was the new trend in “drinking” marijuana.
- Potential “After Grad Party” idea for future substance use prevention.
