 - ~~Black Framed Card Holder (\$1.25)~~
 - ~~\$30 flat rate for text, logo, or combination~~

Teen Advocacy Coalition

- Distribution and Storage:
 - Focus on meaningful distribution – homes of parents / caregivers with young children. Someone will reach out to one of our coalitions with a referral and we coordinate distribution from there. [Track on the spreadsheet.](#)
 - Additional Distribution:
 - Events (Pack2School, Parent Orientation Night, Back 2 School BBQ, etc.)
 - Presentations at organization meeting (Willapa BH, ORT, R2R, etc.)
 - Store storage tools in north and south county accordingly. Our Sheriff's office will take them to people's homes and ask them to fill out the contact card (for follow up) once a referral has been made.
 - A handful will be provided to the schools, FRC's and PI's to hand out. Follow up with the schools monthly for contact cards.
 - Notes – Ask for people's phone numbers. They don't respond to emails.
