Welcome:

1. RX Drop Kiosks

- a. LYPD (Rosanne) - No updates at this time. Rosanne will reach out to Flint.
- b. Shoalwater (Leslie) - Leslie was not present at today's meeting. Table.

2. Campaigns:

- a. Safe Storage Campaign / Medication Lock Bags - no updates at this time. Denise will work on updating the spreadsheet (today) to see who we need to reach out to, so that we can follow up on requests as needed. No updates in South County either, but Jackie will review the South County spreadsheet.
- b. Allison and Denise discussed creating a trifold brochure that will list permanent kiosk collection boxes, take back events (when they are), mail back information, and medication lock bags
 - i. Jackie will check with Tessa to see if CCAA funds can pay for printing the trifold for South County distribution
 - ii. "Community Prevention and Protection"
- c. Denise and Allison are meeting June 1st to discuss medication bags at the pharmacies, a flyer/poster in the window with QR code to request a bag. Duplicate this in ¼ sheet or notecard size for dispensaries.

- i. Dispensaries - encourage locking up marijuana products to keep youth, pets, etc safe.
- ii. Plan to pitch to pharmacies - “come inside and get a bag, or scan this QR code.”
- d. Priority: (1) Trifold, (2) Poster / card for dispensaries
 - i. Foster parents / families
 1. WA State - Give Josh 12 pre-filled bags that he needs and make sure he knows that this is a resource that is available. Give Josh some trifolds
 2. SPIPA (Tribal) South Puget Intertribal Planning Agency - no foster families at this time. Give Kayala some trifolds
 3. Any resident of Pacific County can have a bag

e. Marijuana Prevention + Harm Reduction

YMPEP may or may not do a marijuana prevention campaign. Table for now. Should know more by the next meeting.

f. Fentanyl Awareness Campaign

- i. Intro post: Exactly what it is
- ii. State the facts (image - penny)
- iii. How to have a conversation with your youth about it
- iv. Resources
- v. Fentanyl linked to fake pills (ex: thinking it's one pill and it's laced with fentanyl)
- vi. Naloxone + fentanyl. Extremely important no matter what you think the OD is
 1. + an FAQ

Planning for this campaign - invite Carole, Jackie, Bethany, Jessica?

NOTES:

- WDFW will now be trained to carry naloxone.
- Fentanyl is being found in a variety of substances - not just opioids.
- Kids taking benadryl to boost fentanyl (note - benadryl boosts the effects of other drugs)

3. RX Take Back Event

The Take Back event occurred on April 24th. Pacific County in total collected 111.4 lbs. of unused, unwanted or expired medication at three locations – Pioneer Grocery in South Bend (23.2 pounds), Shoalwater Bay Police Department in Tokeland (38.2) and Sids IGA in Seaview (50 pounds).

Jackie and Allison worked together to create a press release for both county papers.

4. Compliance Checks & Bottle Tagging

Chief Stigall with SBPD is currently working with Officer Don Williams to bump a local alcohol and tobacco sale up to a third offense, while Officer Williams is proceeding with criminal charges. There will be no press release at this time as RPD and PCSO are still conducting stings.

The LCB recently released that they are allowing their officers to resume compliance checks.

Denise presented a draft bottle tag for the committee to review. Suggestions include printing on bright yellow cardstock to grab attention, and adding lines at the top and bottom of the design to also assist in grabbing attention.

5. Communities Talk Activity

The \$750 stipend will be used to purchase bottle tags.

6. Prevention Consultants

Allison followed up with Jesse Eastham before this meeting. There are no updates at this time.

7. Opioid Summit - Bethany / Jackie

The Opioid Summit is taking place virtually on September 14th and 15th.
