Labor Day weekend there will be a yard sale at Crystal's house off of the main highway, they are accepting donations now.
- **Substance Use Prevention Committee**
  - **R2R:** Working on the budget and action plan since it is due this year. We are partnering with TAC on the participant packets and TAC has been running the website. In September our coalition meeting will be September 7th.
  - CPWI Surveys: Drawing for survey participants and they will be at the fair as well. The winner will probably be drawn on September 14th.
  - September 22nd from 8 AM-3 PM is our ACES Trauma informed training with Know and Grown for the SB ELC. Press Release for Compliance Checks through Willapa Harbor Herald, PCHD and R2R's social media. The jackpot/76 gas station had a compliance check conducted in spring the youth attempted to purchase alcohol and tobacco vape product and was successful in the purchase. The store was fined \$700 for the vape product sale and \$2500 for the alcohol sale, which is 5x more than the standard first offense amount due to the youths age and other contributing factors. This compliance check wouldn't have been possible without the partnership of our local law enforcement and R2R.
  - **Social Media Campaigns:** Narcan/Naloxone awareness campaign to coincide with National Overdose Awareness Day
  - **Bottle tagging campaign:** This campaign will be implemented this fall.
