- b. Financial Committee
 - Funding Requests – None
 - Bank of the Pacific Account – Activity since last meeting was \$1,000 deposit (donation from Willapa Harbor Health Foundation for color run); \$1,004.83 expense for color run; and deposit of \$56 color run donations.
 - c. Youth Arm Committee – There has been discussion about what school clubs are going to look like and how it will impact TAC and Peer Helpers; hope to know more soon.
 - Pool Open Swim – 1,250 people signed in for free open swim August 11th-31st.
 - Color Run – 381 participants with ages ranging from 1-95; extended through September 30th due to poor air quality.
 - Sources of Strength Week – The Navigators are interested in partnering again.
 - Red Ribbon Week – October 23rd-31st, looking for ways to implement virtually.

 - d. Substance Use Prevention Committee
 - Permanent Drop Boxes – The Sheriff's Office has new boxes installed in South Bend and Long Beach. Old box will be transferred to South Bend Pharmacy. Rack cards and magnets with north county permanent drop box locations are under development.
 - Opioid Prevention Campaign – Share-outs have been posted on Facebook every two weeks by TAC, R2R, WellSpring, SBPD, and PCSO; the last one was sent out today.
 - Safe Storage – Requests for free locking medication bags are currently being accepted.
 - Bottle Tag Project – Next project for committee; tag alcohol bottles to reduce underage drinking; hope to implement soon.
 - Rx Drug Take Back Day – October 24th from 10a-2p; will be drive through; location TBD.
